

TracDat/SLO Process Help sessions	I/D	Toño Mary	Issue raised by Bradley & Mi: Currently SLO's in ECMS are numbered. As the ECMS course outline application is being updated to incorporate editing of SLO statements it became apparent that the initiators would have to manually manage the numbering on the SLO statements. Therefore the decision was made to remove the numbers and instead the statements would become bullet points. This will actually better parallel the intent of the meaning of "Active" and "Inactive" choices for SLO statements on TracDat.

SLO Statements			Curriculum Committee is overseeing quality control evidenced by the fact that some faculty have been asked to re-word the SLO statements when submitting course outlines for five-year review. However, due to the updates that Bradley Creamer is working on, updating SLO statements on ECMS is not possible at this time.
			As a rule of thumb, SLO statements should be written to facilitate a none-area expert to fully comprehend the statement's meaning. It was further discussed that the Program Review will continue to incorporate SLO Assessment work at the same or greater level as in the APRU of 2011-12.
			Logically, there needs to be a decision on when/where/how the SLO statements for each course will be made public. Currently they cannot be seen for any courses on the course outline public site – not even for the courses that have had a five-year review as of Fall 2012. This is a matter for discussion at the next Steering Committee meeting.
