

Military Service Credit

Credit will be given for active duty of one year or more in the military service when a student submits a copy of his DD214 discharge to the Registrar. A total of nine quarter units will be posted to the student's Permanent Record.

Military Science

Military Science is offered to qualified students enrolled at De Anza College on a full-time basis. Classes and leadership laboratory are conducted at San Jose State College under the supervision of the Professor of Military Science, San Jose State College. Students may complete the first two years of Army ROTC while enrolled at De Anza College and qualify for enrollment in the advanced courses (3rd and 4th year) at degree-granting colleges or universities. Completion of ROTC and a baccalaureate degree qualify students for a commission in the United States Army Reserve. Students may obtain enrollment forms from their counselor or the Department of Military Science, San Jose State College.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ASSOCIATE IN ARTS OR SCIENCE DEGREE DE ANZA COLLEGE

THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ASSOCIATE DEGREE INCLUDE COMPLETION OF (1) A MINIMUM OF 96 UNITS, (2) A MINIMUM OF 24 UNITS TAKEN AT DE ANZA COLLEGE, (3) A GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF "C" OR BETTER IN ALL COLLEGE COURSES, (4) A GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF "C" OR BETTER IN ALL COURSES TAKEN AT DE ANZA COLLEGE (5) A MAJOR OF NOT LESS THAN 30 UNITS IN A CURRICULUM APPROVED BY THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE, AND (6) GENERAL EDUCATION (BREADTH) REQUIREMENTS LISTED BELOW.

A. State Minimum Requirements:

1. American History and Institutions Minimum of 4 Units
Political Science 1 or 51, or History 17A and 17B, or
History 17A and 17C or History 17A and Political Science 6 or History 17A and History 10 or History 17A and 18C.
2. Language Arts As specified under section B below
3. Health 21* 3 Units
4. Physical Education† 3 Units

*Veterans with one or more years' service may petition for credit during the quarter immediately PRIOR to graduation. This requirement is met by other courses in approved career curriculums in the health sciences.

†Exception granted for the following reasons only: (1) A veteran with one or more years' service (by petition), (2) Physician's written excuse, renewed each quarter, (3) Over 21 years of age prior to the first day of instruction, (4) Post graduate standing, (5) Enrolled in eight units or fewer.

B. Additional Requirements:

1. Guidance 50, 51, 52, 53, or 54.‡ 1 Unit
2. Passing grade in Minimum Standards Arithmetic Test or satisfactory completion of Mathematics 200 or of another mathematics course in college.
3. (a) FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS: Lower division requirements (1) for the chosen major and (2) for general education, at the accredited college or university a student designates as the one to which he will transfer.
 (b) FOR ALL OTHER STUDENTS:
 1. English 1A and Speech 1A or 15 or 16 or English 3 and Speech 1A or 15 or 16
 Minimum of 8 Units
 2. Biological or Physical Science Minimum of 4 Units
 3. Social Science, Literature, and Philosophy (in addition to A above) Minimum of 8 Units
 4. Fine Arts (Art, Music, Photography, Theater Arts) Minimum of 4 Units
 - *5. Ethnic Studies (Asian, Black, Chicano, Ethnic) Minimum of 4 Units

High School Completion

Although De Anza College cannot grant a high school diploma, many high schools in the area recommend that students eighteen years of age or older complete their high school requirements by taking college courses. A student who chooses to obtain a diploma in this way should obtain a statement from the principal or a counselor of the high school indicating:

1. The subjects necessary for completion of the requirements for graduation and the number of quarter credits in each.
2. Suggestions, if possible, of De Anza College courses which may satisfy these high school requirements.
3. The total number of quarter credits required, including electives.
4. Acceptance of credit for courses taken at De Anza College.

The California State Department of Education has recommended that equivalent credit be granted on the following basis:
